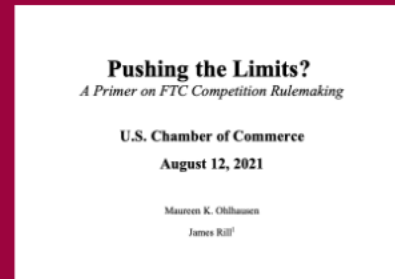

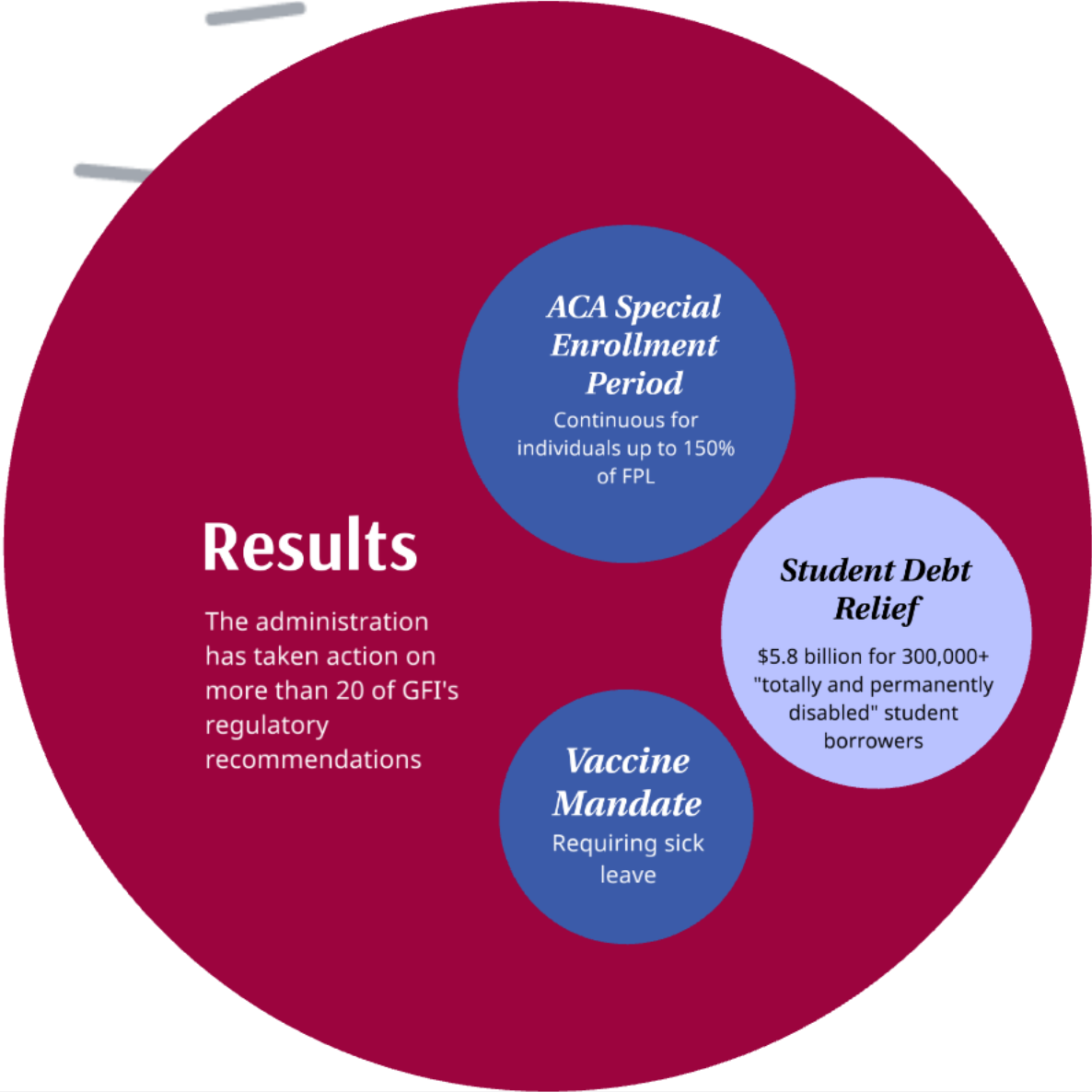

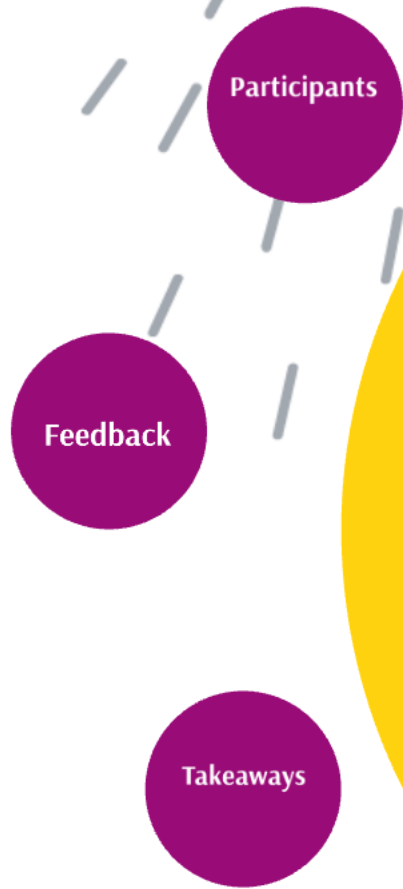

This is a "huge gap in the movement," she said. "An organization is very much needed: I don't have 5 lawyers who can dive into a statute."

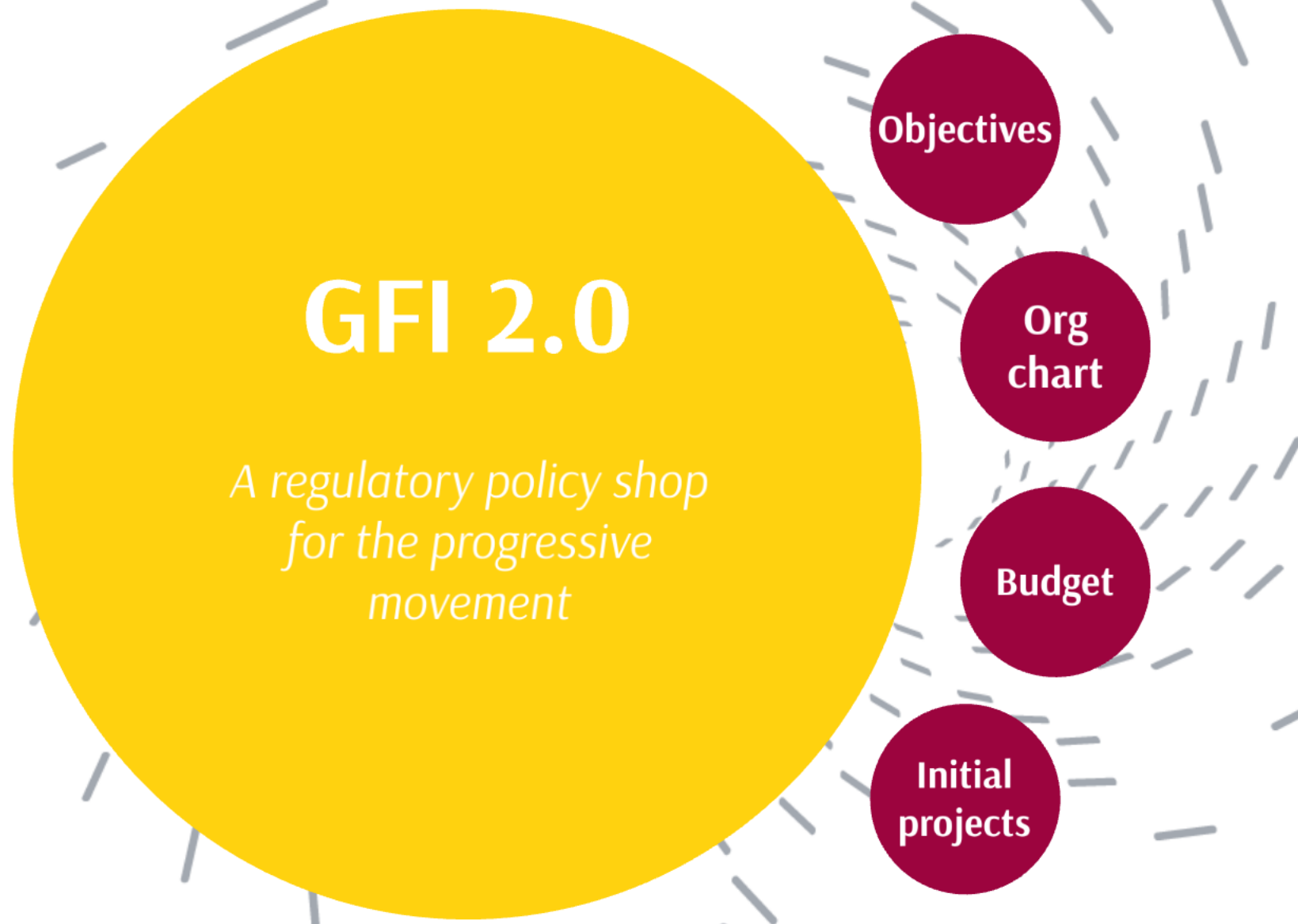

Unfriendly administration

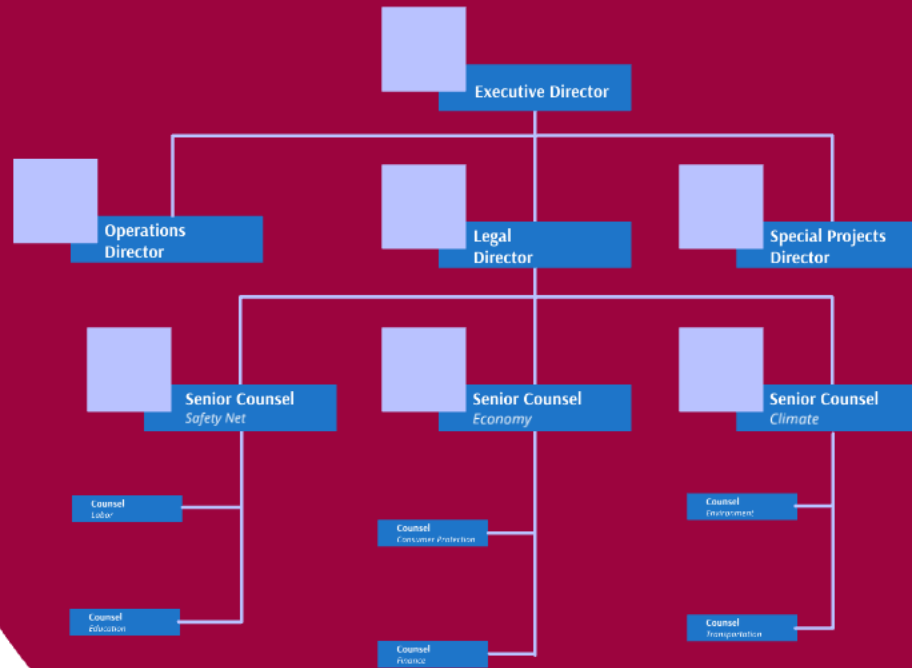
Slow down or block deregulation
